Systemair acquires Austrian manufacturer of Air Handling Units

Systemair AB (NASDAQ OMX Stockholm: SYSR) has acquired the Austrian company FRIVENT Luft- & Wärmetechnik GmbH, a high-quality manufacturer of air handling units.

Frivent is located in St. Johann in Tirol, Austria, and achieves a turnover of around 7 million EUR by selling to commercial and industrial applications in Austria, Germany, Czech and Russia. The company produces air handling units, heat recovery systems and unique roof units for several niche applications.

"We see great opportunities with the company's unique knowledge within niche applications and their current market presence. This acquisition gives us a strengthened position in the region and a possibility to coordinate our activities in Austria", says Systemair's President and CEO Roland Kasper.

Systemair in brief

Systemair is a leading ventilation company with operations in 49 countries in Europe, North- and South America, the Middle East, Asia and Africa. The Company had sales of SEK 6.1 billion in financial year 2015/16 and currently employs about 5,000 people. Systemair has reported an operating profit every year since 1974, when the Company was founded. During the past 15 years, the Company's growth rate has averaged about 12 percent.

Systemair has well-established operations in growth markets. The Group's products are marketed under the Systemair, Frico, VEAB, Fantech, Menerga and Holland Heating brands. Systemair shares have been quoted on the Mid Cap List of the OMX Nordic Exchange in Stockholm since October 2007. The Group comprises about 60 companies.
